Re: Visitation

We are thrilled to be able to have family members and friends visit our residents again. As I have previously shared with you, the policies received from both national and state regulators are in a continuous state of change so need to update you on the latest protocols. These go into effect on Wednesday, March 31st and are as follows:

- Hours for visitations will be from 10:00 a.m.-5:00 p.m.
- Health Center residents will continue to have indoor visits in the chapel but the visits will be extended from 30 to 60 minutes.
- Assisted Living and North Ridge indoor visits will take place in residents' apartments. To comply with social distancing guidelines, no more than 2 visitors can visit with the resident at one time. These visits will also be extended from 30 to 60 minutes.
- We will have two calendars: one for indoor visits which requires either the resident to be vaccinated or the visitor to be vaccinated and the second calendar will be for outdoor visits for residents and visitors who are not vaccinated.
- Visits must be scheduled in advance. Please go to www.calendly.com/eliseovisitations to reserve your visitation time.
- For an indoor visit to occur, either the resident must be vaccinated or the visitor must be vaccinated. There are no exceptions to this.
- Per the Washington Department of Health/Department of Social and Health Services regulations, we will ask for proof of vaccination. This information will remain confidential and not allow others to be aware of your status. Please show the Receptionist your vaccination card when checking in for your visit.
- For all indoor visits, a resident may choose not to social distance, however, all parties must continue to wear disposable medical masks. We do ask that you social distance with others visiting families, residents, and staff while on the campus.

- Visitors to the Assisted Living Apartments are asked to proceed directly to the resident's apartment and not wander the halls or visit in common areas. The Harbor Café is off-limits to visitors at this time.

Lastly, while we have not yet been given permission for meals to be shared during visits, please know you are able to drop off food and beverage items with the Receptionist for residents. The items will be delivered shortly after you drop them off.
